This assignment involves the creation of your very own personal Web portfolio. The purpose of these web pages is to present yourself to a potential employer. To successfully complete this assignment, you are to follow the guidelines below and upload all files to euler by 9:25am on the date in which the assignment is due. I will only grade your Web pages from euler and will access the main Web page with the following command: **<http://euler.math.pacificu.edu/~yourloginname/getajob/main.html>** where yourloginname is the login name you type before typing in your password to connect to euler.

Main Web Page

Your main Web page is to use a graphic that provides a large border on the left side of the screen. The border area is to contain navigation links to the other Web pages required below. The rest of the page is to contain the main information for the Web page.

The main Web page is to contain a personal biography of you. Tell people about you. Share as much or as little about yourself as you feel comfortable. This page may or may not include a picture of yourself. Remember, your Web page will not be accessed by the outside world.

The navigation links in the first column in order are:

- 1) Home – takes the viewer to the main Web page.
- 2) Schedule – this page contains your complete Pacific University course schedule is to be displayed in a table with the column headings: (a) Course Number (e.g. CS120) (b) Course Name (e.g. The Information Era) (c) Time (e.g. 4:00PM - 5:15PM) (d) Location (e.g. MAR LL21) (e) Instructor (e.g. Ryan). Also, for each instructor that has a Web page, create a link to that page through the instructor's last name.
- 3) Major – this page contains a description of your major, why you chose this major, and what you plan to do with your major after graduation. Further, this page is to contain a minimum of five links to useful sites related to your major.
- 4) Hobbies – this page describes your hobbies and contains five links to Web sites related to those hobbies.
- 5) Background Info – most web sites that provide free backgrounds require a link back to the site of where the background was downloaded; therefore, if you use one of the backgrounds from class, the site is <http://desktoppublishing.com>. If you decide to use a background from some other site, be sure to follow the policies described on that site and provide a link back to that site from your web pages.

Note1: The navigation and background for each Web page in this project is to be identical. As one clicks to different pages, the first column must look the same and not change in any way from page to page.

Note2: Be sure to use as many of the HTML tags that we have used in class as possible.

Note3: These web pages will be viewed with the Firefox web browser for grading. Make sure they display properly with that browser on a Macintosh computer in LL12.

Note4: Feel free to add additional links and images. Always document your sources.

Note5: Grading will be based on the following given the above assignment requirements:

- a) completeness – Did you do everything required by the assignment? Have you used most of the HTML tags we've discussed in a meaningful way?
- b) correctness – Did you correctly build each Web page?
- c) Professionalism – Are each of your Web pages professionally constructed and viewed?
- d) Grammar & Spelling – Make sure you use proper grammar and spelling when constructing each Web page.

Have a blast and get started early on this assignment. There are lots of little pieces to this project and way too many for me to handle the night before. Please come see me if you have any questions. I will want to go over things we did in class so make sure all of your class examples exists on euler including the completed HTML Info example with backgrounds and navigational tools. Good luck!!!
