Anchors

- All the links that we have created so far have been links to other web pages
- It is possible to create links to locations on the same web page
- Each location is given a name
- The link references that name

Types of Hyperlinks

- Three basic types of hyperlinks
 - Absolute URL
 - <a href=<u>http://www.amazon.com</u>>Go to Amazon
 - Relative URL: link to another web page on the same server
 - Go to Page 2
 - Named Anchor: link to different location on the same page
 - We'll see examples of these next

Named Anchors

- The tag used is the same one used for hyperlinks
- Different attributes are used
 - o Link label: link name
 - Link destination: <aname="name">destination
- Example:

```
<a href="#loc1">Go to examples</a>
```
